## MUSIC EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

- Senior Recorder (preparation for Opera House performance) 30 minute lesson with Mrs Tuyl on Tuesdays during class time until the performance, then fortnightly lessons with Ms Hamer on Thursday mornings during class time for the rest of the year
