This Friday we will celebrate NAIDOC Day with a series of rotating activities in the middle session.



The Astronauts have welcomed some new faces to the classroom in the past fortnight. Mrs Hoitink now joins us for the morning literacy sessions as well as Year 3-4 maths in the middle session. This will continue for the rest of the term. Today Mr Callinan, a teaching student from Newcastle University, begins a four-week practicum on our 3-6 class and our new students Taylor and Cooper have settled in well and delighted classmates with speeches about the rocks and shells they collected on their travels around Australia. Year 5-6 students have been putting their maths skills to practical use as they study the Pyramids of Giza, construct scale models of the site and create timelines of Egypt's pyramid building dynasties. We are all enjoying our author study on Emily Rodda. As a class we are reading His Name Was Walter and students have written letters to Emily to tell her a little about our school and share their enthusiasm for her books. Our focus on perspective in art lessons continues to result in some outstanding works being created. Last week's focus self-portraits was foreshortening and linear perspective. Today and

tomorrow our Year 5/6 students, leaders of the future, are participating in peer support training. The two days of activities will culminate in our students leading small groups of peers on a range of wellbeing activities later this year and next year.


