### Library News

From now until the end of term all students will be learning and using their visualising skills in library activities. This skill is essential for building reading comprehension.

Students will learn that as we read, we create mental images of what is happening in the story as it unfolds, based on what we already know and understand about the world around us. We are tapping into prior knowledge, making connections, inferring information, and paying attention to details. Characters are created in our minds and our own unique version of the story begins to play out in our imaginations, just like a movie. The great part of these lessons that excite students the most is that simple fact that there are no right or wrong answers. When readers visualise, they create pictures in their minds that are unique to them. Visualising also allows students to develop their listening skills. This is a skill, which as parents, you can reinforce at home when you are reading to your children. As of last week, all students have begun the Premier's Reading Challenge. Students in Years 3-6 have to read a total of 20 books between now and August, 15 of which are selected texts and 5 of their own choice. Students have been shown how to log these books on the PRC website. Students in K-2 will have their books read to them during class times.

### Cross Country Trials and Colour Explosion

Following our assembly on March 20 all students will be participating in Bullying No Way Day peer activities for the morning session. Parents and community members are more than welcome to stay for these activities.

We will then be holding the school cross country trial inside the school grounds at 1.30pm (weather and grounds permitting) for those students turning 8 and up this year.

All students will then be involved in Colour Explosion activities from 2pm, concluding with a colourful run around the oval. We are hoping that parents and our community will come and join in the fun!

Glasses and a Zooper Dooper will be provided to students on the day. Students require an old white T-shirt, a change of clothes or a towel to go home as the children will be very colourful and wet! ### NAPLAN -Year 3 and Year 5

In preparation for national NAPLAN testing in May, Ms Hartigan last week completed test administrator training. The official NAPLAN online testing will take place for Year 3 and Year 5 students between May 12 and 22 and there will be an online practice test on Monday, March 23. The practice test is designed to introduce students to the NAPLAN format and ensure all computer hardware at a local and national level is ready to support the testing. It will not be marked. Ms Hartigan is beginning to introduce Year 3 and 5 students to the NAPLAN format in numeracy, reading, language conventions and writing and is confident they will all do their best come test time. The NAPLAN timetable for our students will be released shortly. If you have any queries about NAPLAN, please see Ms Hartigan.

It's been another busy fortnight in the 3-6 classroom with Science experiments, Year 6 excursions, an introduction to NAPLAN and completion of the first part of our History unit. Our silkworms were growing nicely as they chomped through juicy mulberry leaves (check out the pictures) but unfortunately there has been a sad development over the weekend with the demise of the entire stock. There is no obvious reason for this turn of events and we will continue with our studies using research to follow the lifecycle of the silkworm. We had better luck with our seeds which sprouted beautifully in our experiment jars. If you haven't checked out our time lapse video that shows mung beans coming to life, jump onto the school Facebook page and have a look. We are nearing the end of the first part of our History unit which saw students act out the Dreamtime story of the black swans using Playdoh characters. Students will complete an in-class assessment on the topic today before we start looking at Changing Communities. A big congratulations to our five Year 6 students who attended the Halogen Young Leaders Conference last week. They were wonderful ambassadors for our school and returned full of inspiration and tips on how to be great leaders.

The Athletics carnival will be held on Thursday 26 March.


