ACCOUNTS

HOME READERS & LIBRARY BOOKS

K-2 students change their home readers on a weekly basis as part of homework. Currently, a rather large amount of home-readers and library books have not been returned. Please return these by the end of the term or unfortunately we will have to invoice parents for their replacement.

COVID: EXPLAINING ALL ABSENCES

It is vitally important that any absences including partial absences from school are explained as soon as possible. Students who return to school after an illness or day/s absent MUST have provided an explanation before or on the day of return.

Normally parents have 7 days to explain the absence, but COVID guidelines require a more stringent reporting process. A reminder that any student tested for COVID must provide evidence of a negative result before they can return to school. (E.g. screen shot, Doctors Certificate, clinic notice). If students have had symptoms and have *not* been tested they are to be excluded from school for a period of 10 days. Additionally, the student must be symptom free for at least 3 days before returning to school.

Thank you for keeping our students safe and meeting this COVID requirement.

It was great to see some sustained eye contact, discrete use of palm cards and to hear loud, clear voices.


Riddle of the week
