Wellbeing Programs

The aim of the Rock and Water program is to teach young people skills of self-awareness, increase self-confidence and social functioning. Last week's Rock and Water lesson was called "Beach and Tunnel". In this lesson we explored what it means to be a "beach person" - someone who is calm and confident, they express this through their body language. When we are "beach" our head is held high, we make eye contact and stand straight. We explored how this posture makes us feel and how this posture impacts the way that we interact with others. When we are "tunnel" we are closed off to the world, we have retreated into ourselves, our eyes are cast down, our shoulders hunched. This body language tells people that we are not confident, not able to speak for ourselves, not able to stand up for ourselves.

Using these two ideas we explored the scenario of walking past a difficult group of strangers who were intimidating. The students each had their turn to be a "beach" and walk past the group without allowing the strangers to intimidate or scare them.

A fantastic way to consolidate learning is to *teach* what we know to somebody else. Perhaps families could find time to have their students teach them all about "beach and tunnel" and practice modelling being a beach at home.


