Student Health and Contacts

It is important that the school has up-to-date information about student health needs and contact information. This includes allergies and other medical conditions that need to be managed by the school. Please contact the school if you need to update our school records.

COVID Smart Measures Term 1 2023 We are continuing our COVID-smart measures into 2023.

While the community continues to transition towards living with COVID-19, NSW Health advised that the unpredictable nature of the virus will continue to present a health risk to the community, with new waves of transmission expected this year. Our school will continue to operate with baseline COVID-smart measures in place this term to minimise transmission. These include a combination of layered safety measures, such as:

- Staying home if unwell and test for COVID-19 if showing any symptoms
- Boosted day cleaning of high-touch areas in our schools
- Strongly encouraging masks to be worn by all students, staff and visitors, particularly when indoors or outdoors when physical distancing is difficult to maintain
- Strongly encouraging up-to-date vaccinations for our staff and students, including COVID-19 booster shots for anyone eligible
- Maintaining natural ventilation with windows and doors open whenever possible, including when cooling/heating systems are in use
- Continuing to provide RATs and other hygiene products to schools free of charge.

Third Party Website and Software Consent

Iona Public School is committed to providing a technology-rich environment for our students. Our school community considers the use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) fundamental in teaching and learning in all areas of the school curriculum.

It has been a very busy start to the new school year for Year 2/3 students. Everyone has settled into the new year beautifully and Ms McDonnell is so impressed with their manners and work habits.

A big welcome to Logan, who joins us this year! Each morning, 2/3 have been working on some writing and spelling. We have looked closely at the use of verbs and how choosing great verbs can make our writing more interesting! For the

next few weeks, we will be focusing on persuasive texts.

Home readers were sent home on Friday. Students are asked to read them regularly and return them a couple of times a week to swap them. Some students might now be reading novels, therefore, reading a chapter or a few pages per night. They will need to keep those books longer to be able to read the whole book. In math sessions we have looked at place value in three and four-digit numbers. We've also been looking at mathematical problems and discussing the most efficient way to solve them.

Throughout this term, we will be studying "Living Things" in Science, features of places during Geography sessions and talking about our wellbeing in Health lessons.

2/3 students will also complete some artwork based on these themes. Next Wednesday, we welcome Ms Baxter, who will teach 2/3 every Wednesday.









4-6

Welcome back everyone! It was so lovely to see all the bright, smiling faces back at school. 4-6 have hit the ground running with a busy few days, as well as the swimming carnival.

We are pleased to say all students have settled in nicely and have shown they are ready for a year full of fun, friendship, and learning.

We welcome Hallee to our 4-6 family and look forward to our year together.

Our literacy activities this term include investigating different text types including flowcharts and informative texts. We will be developing some strategies to help with comprehension and visualisation when reading a text. We are also learning about the structure of persuasive texts so they can improve their writing skills.

In Maths, students will be working in small groups for explicit lessons focused on their stage outcomes, will reflect on previous learning through number warmups and number talks and will complete daily maths mentals to solidify mental maths strategies. Students will also complete a range of skill-based activities such as maths-based games and problem solving challenges.

4-6 will complete Science lessons with Ms Tully, History and Geography with Mr Tarry and for this term, Creative Arts with Mrs Bird.
