

The stall will be held on Thursday 31 August. Gifts are priced between \$2-\$10. Please remember to send cash and a bag to take the gift home in.








Book Week

In Maths we have been working on collating data and then putting this information into a picture graph. The kids are having lots of fun making our graphs.

We are still focusing on our cricket skills during sport, we have some amazing future cricket players!!

Last week we said goodbye to Mr Boyce, who was completing his internship in our room for the last 6 weeks. We hope that he has valued his time here and we wish him lots of success in his teaching career.

This week, the Dolphins are learning about metaphors and using them, as well as complex sentences to write some terrific sentences. All students are working hard on their reading skills, and many are getting very close to an end of year book prize for reading for 200 nights. This is really reflected in their classroom read-aloud time. In Mathematics we have been really focusing on multiplication and division, using arrays. We have also looked at halving and doubling and how we can use them to do multiplication. For example, if we see 3x8 we can halve the 8 so we can do 3x4 and then double the answer. This makes multiplication much easier.

We are looking at heat in Science and have been investigating how heat can be used in everyday objects, such as a candle, hot water bottle and a jug!

We are continuing to build on cricket skills during Friday sport sessions.

Welcome to Week 7! Last week we had our wonderful book week celebration. I was so impressed by the costumes and how some of our students embodied the characters as well. We have Father's Day coming up and will be busy making some presents for Dad this week. In Literacy we have been working on our website, we have added text, our own sketches, pictures and videos.




